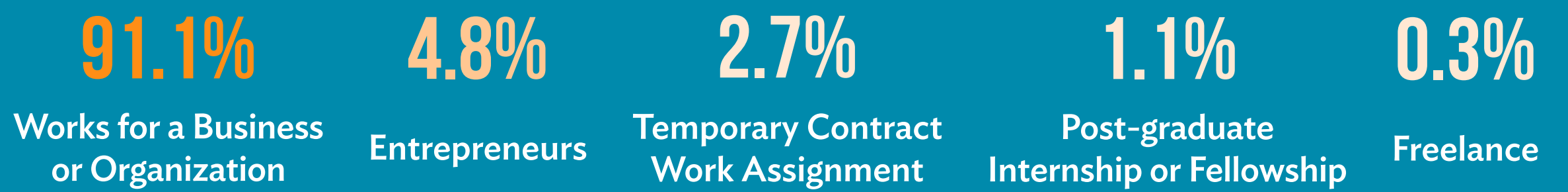

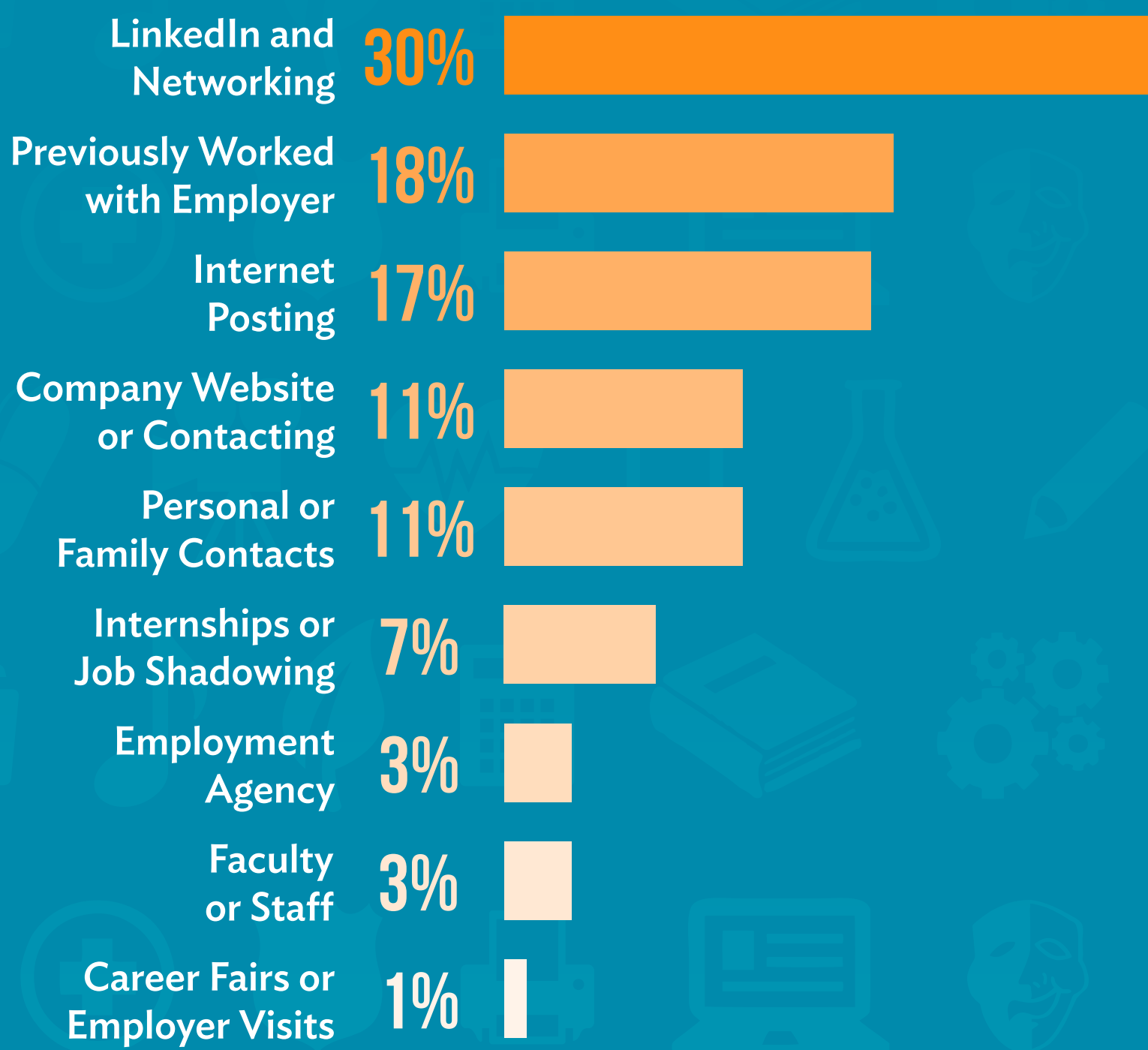

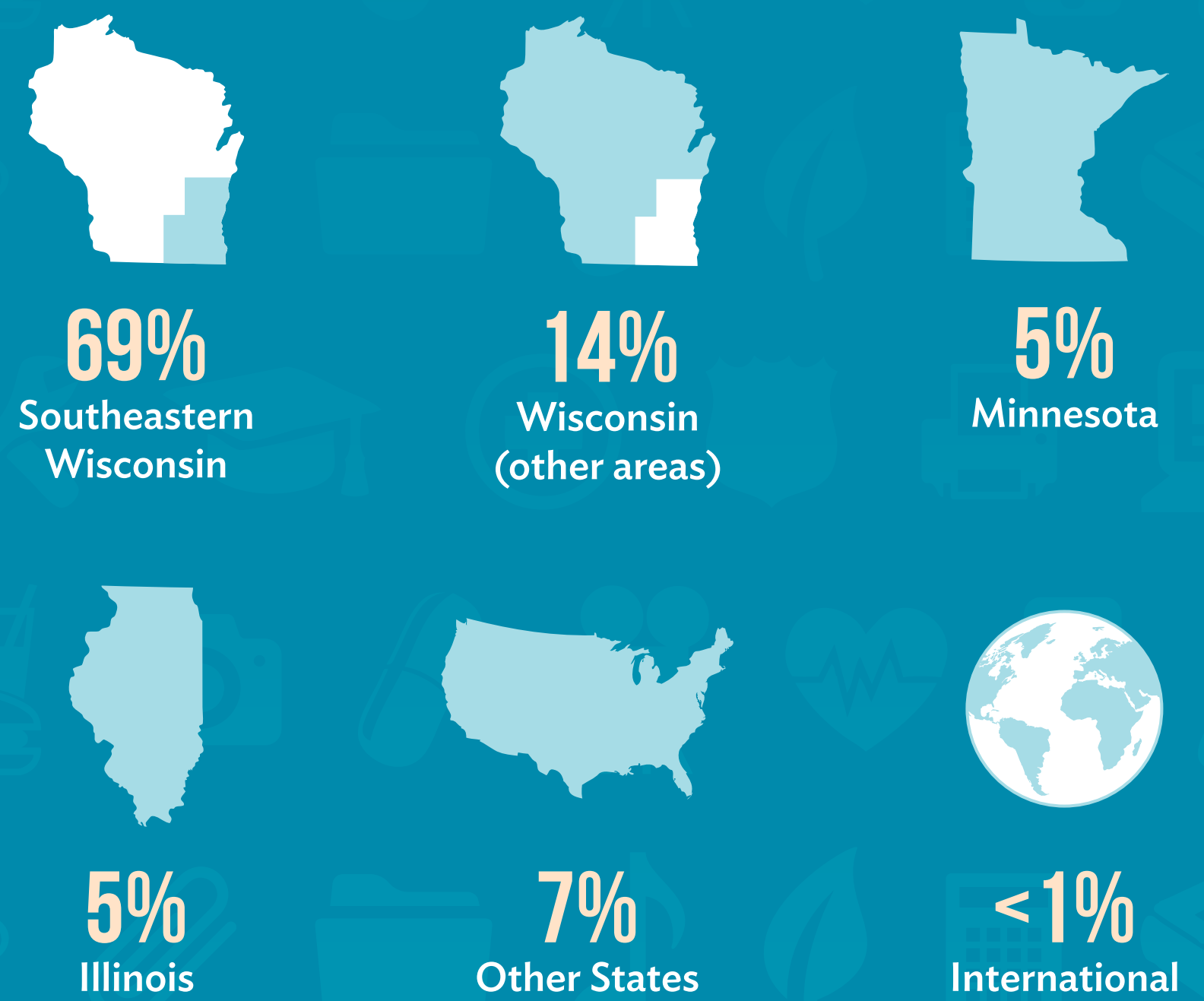
TOP STUDY ABROAD LOCATIONS FOR STRITCH STUDENTS LAST 5 YEARS ³
