Title IX is federal legislation that prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex and gender in education programs, including athletic programs or activities that receive federal funding.

What is Title IX?

Title IX is federal legislation that prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex and gender in education programs, including athletic programs or activities that receive federal funding. Under Title IX, discrimination on the basis of sex or gender can include sexual harassment and interpersonal violence including: stalking, relationship violence and sexual violence or misconduct.
