

# **Samuel Cardinal Stritch Service Award**

*For students enrolled in traditionally taught undergraduate programs.*

Faculty, staff and students of our University community are invited to submit nominees for the Samuel Cardinal Stritch outstanding student service award for students enrolled in traditionally taught undergraduate programs. Students are welcome to nominate themselves or other students for this award.

The award is selected on the basis of the following criteria (will be verified by the Student Affairs Committee as part of the selection process):

- A student who graduated in December 2017 or will graduate in May or August 2018.
- A student with a history of exceptional service which reflects Franciscan values at Stritch and/or in the community.
- A student with a record of outstanding leadership either at Stritch and/or in the community while enrolled.
- A student with a solid record of academic achievement (a minimum 3.0 GPA is required).

Your name and status (faculty, staff or student)

Name of the student you are nominating

Award for which you are nominating the student (i.e. Samuel Cardinal Stritch Award)

A written paragraph that addresses the following (to the extent known by you, nominees may be contacted if further information is required):

- 1) How has the nominee exhibited the Franciscan values at Stritch, in the community or in the professional field?
- 2) Detail any special academic achievements and/or contributions the student has made while enrolled at Stritch.
- 3) Detail the nominee's leadership involvement at Stritch, in the community, or in the professional field while enrolled at Stritch.
